Eagle Down's Director of Operations meets with Senior United Nations Officials

Mississauga, ON – January 29, 2007 – Fatmire Feka, The Eagle Down Foundation's Director of Operations met with senior UN officials in Kosovo on Friday, 26 January 2007 as part of an organized visit by youth leaders from across the province of Kosovo.

Fatmire had the opportunity to meet and discuss issues plaguing Kosovo's youth with a number of senior officials from the Organization for Security and Cooperation in Europe (OSCE) and from the United Nations Administration Mission in Kosovo (UNMIK) including the UN Secretary General's Special Representative, Mr. Joachim Rucker. Mr. Rucker was appointed to his current position by the then United Nations Secretary General, Mr. Kofi Annan in September 2006.

According to Fatmire, "this series of meetings with senior officials from the UN and other international organizations allowed us to share our hopes and ambitions for a peaceful, tolerant and multi-ethnic Kosovo where we can all live side by side as we rebuild from years of turmoil and conflict."
